

**MAGGIE MORRISON**



**SPALDING JR., F**  
Morrison was the Cavaliers' leading scorer with 18 goals and 10 assists, including six game-winners — one in the IAAM A Conference title game. She

collected 35 goals and 16 assists in her career.  
"Her ability to attack the goal despite constant double- and triple-teams was extraordinary," Cavaliers coach Bob Dieterle said.

**MELANIE WATERS**



**CHESAPEAKE SR., F**  
Waters led the Cougars offensively with 16 goals and five assists and overall with her leadership and work ethic. Waters was a second-team All-State selection.

"She's a great leader, and as hard as she worked in games, she worked even harder in practice," Chesapeake coach Liz Farrell said. "That was important because we had a young team, and she set a good example."

**ALLI CISLO**



**OLD MILL FR., F**  
Cislo led the Patriots in scoring with 11 goals and three assists. Her savvy play and nose for the ball helped turn around an Old Mill program that finished 2-9-2 a

season ago and improved to 6-7.  
"She really helped turn us around offensively," Patriots coach Michelle Sanders said. "She was a major threat in every game we played — even games that she didn't score in."

**COURTNEY HOYES**



**SPALDING SR., F**  
Hoyes was the Cavaliers' second-leading scorer with 16 goals — six game-winners — and six assists. She leaves with 33 goals and 17 assists.

"Courtney showed great strength and determination at the striker position," Cavaliers coach Bob Dieterle said. "She was effective at using her height and her positioning to become a constant scoring threat on corner kicks."

**MEGHEN JACKSON**



**BROADNECK SR., F**  
A second-team All-State pick and a constant scoring threat, Jackson notched 13 goals and five assists for the Bruins. She scored the game-winner in a

1-0 upset over Arundel on the regular season's last day.  
"She is a dynamic player," Broadneck coach John Camm said. "She was a threat to score every time she touched the ball in the attacking third."

**LAREL ROGERS**



**SOUTH RIVER SR., F**  
Rogers led the Class 4A East Region champion Seahawks with 14 goals and six assists. She combined her speed and ability with her composure

near the goal to be an offensive force.  
"I think that's what allowed her to transfer from a midfielder last year to a forward this year and become our leading scorer," Seahawks coach John Sis said.

**ALYSSA BRUMMITT**



**ANNAPOLIS JR., F**  
Brummitt led the Panthers with eight goals and three assists after an injury.  
"Alyssa is the best first-touch player I have coached,"

Annapolis coach Brooke Walsh said. "She has an extremely accurate and powerful shot that makes her a threat to score every time she touches the ball. And she never plays a bad ball."

**GABBY MORENO**



**SEVERNA PARK SO., M**  
Moreno blew past her peers with quick feet and crisp ball control to lead the Falcons with 11 goals and six assists.

"Gabby's biggest fault is that she makes it look too easy," Severna Park coach Todd Clark said. "It's easy to lose sight of just how quickly she can turn a game with a single touch. When her footwork is on full display, she is usually dangerous."

**SYDNEY KEER**



**ARUNDEL SR., M**  
The Wildcats' central midfielder, who kept things quiet in the back, scored eight goals and spread four assists to lead the injury-laden

Wildcats secure a fourth spot in the Class 4A East Region playoffs and upset top-seeded Severna Park to get to the final.  
Equally effective in the backfield, Keer helped Arundel allow only 13 goals in 18 games and start the season 11-0.

**AMANDA NOVY**



**SEVERNA PARK SR., M**  
A team captain, Novy was one of three Falcons to score at least nine goals, and her five assists were second on the team. She acted as

a coach on the field and has a keen eye for passing, while attacking the ball.  
"When all facets of her game are on," Severna Park coach Todd Clark said, "it's like having a 12th player on the pitch."

**HEATHER SMITH**



**GLEN BURNIE SR., M/DEF.**  
A two-year captain and honorable mention All-State pick, Smith finished her career with 39 goals and 25 assists, with 10 points earned while

on defense this season.  
"Our team defense was vastly improved this season in large part due to Heather," Gophers coach Steven Baxter said. "Heather has been the ultimate team player."

**SAMMIE NORMAN**



**BROADNECK SR., DEF.**  
Norman, who has an uncanny ability to read the field, was the anchor of the Bruins' defense, and also contributed on offense with six assists and two

scores. She was a second-team All-State pick.  
"She was very physical in the back, a strong tackler, and offensively she was very dangerous on free kicks," Broadneck coach John Camm said.

**KIRSTEN FRANK**



**SPALDING SR., DEF.**  
Frank, who'll play at Ohio, is one of the best shutdown defenders in the IAAM, assisting her goalkeeper in yielding only six goals over 21 games.

"Kirsten made an immediate impact on the team when she arrived four years ago," Cavaliers coach Bob Dieterle said. "She was the backbone of the defense this year. Her game is well-suited for the next level."

**LYNDSE HOKANSON**



**SOUTH RIVER SR., GK**  
A first-team All-State selection, Hokanson made 35 saves and allowed only nine goals for the Class 4A East Regional champion Seahawks.

"Lyndse was our defensive MVP," South River coach John Sis said. "Her athletic ability matches her leadership role, and that was just a huge factor for us getting to the state semis."

**JOCELYN MCCOY**



**SPALDING SR., GK**  
The backstop for the IAAM A Conference champion Cavaliers, McCoy allowed four goals over 21 games, netting a 0.19 goals-against

average with 16 shutouts.  
"She has great leaping ability, fine lateral movement and is an excellent shot blocker," Cavaliers coach Bob Dieterle said. "She showed leadership, poise and courage."

**LEXI CAVEY**



**SEVERNA PARK SO., GK**  
Cavey gave up only seven goals all season, but just one in league play. She made 123 saves for a percentage of .943, while collecting 12

consecutive shutouts — 10 in a row.  
"To me, what really stands out is her ability to play with her feet and start the attack," Falcons coach Todd Clark said. "A lot of our offense starts with a really smart distribution from the back."

**COACH OF YEAR: BOB DIETERLE, SPALDING**



Dieterle led the Cavaliers through a murderer's row of state- and nationally-ranked opponents en route to a 20-0-1 finish that resulted in their third Interscholastic Athletic Association of Maryland A Conference championship in three years.  
Archbishop Spalding — which allowed six goals in 1,722 minutes, 15 seconds — trailed John Carroll for the majority of the A Conference semifinal before fighting back for a last-minute score en route to a double-overtime victory.  
"You could tell we weren't going to lose that game," Dieterle said. "You could see it in their eyes."  
The Cavaliers held Mercy to one shot in the final for the title.  
"It takes a special kind of girl to play for Spalding," Dieterle said.
